Albany, N.Y., April 13—State Senator Tom O'Mara (R-C, Big Flats) was joined at the Capitol this week by two area high school students who were among 30 students from across the state participating in the 11th Annual "Students Inside Albany" conference sponsored by the League of Women Voters of New York State (LOWV).

The conference took place from April 10-13.
