


Senator Young Given Tour of Lutheran Social Services New 'Smartbuilding'

A new "Smartment" building was constructed to include 14 apartments with technology built into them that can help people remain independent and lead healthier lives. Senator Young also toured the new addition to the Hultquist Place assisted living facility that includes a new grand entrance with heated sidewalks and drop-off area.
