He was promoted to Lance Corporal on April 1, 2009, and then to Corporal on February 1, 2010.

Currently, Corporal Barden is stationed at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton in California, and recently returned from a deployment to Musa Qala, Afghanistan.
