Senator Young recently stopped by the SUNY Fredonia Technology Incubator to meet with business owners whose ideas have started to come to fruition thanks to the assistance provided by the Incubator. When the Incubator was in its developmental stages and before a shovel had ever been put in the ground, Senator Young worked with SUNY Fredonia officials to have the facility located downtown instead of on campus. Senator Young announced also that the Incubator would be receiving \$100,000 from the recent State Budget for operating expenses, a huge shot in the arm for the businesses that benefit from its services.
