

Murphy, Westchester Medical Center, highlight National Burn Awareness Week

VALHALLA, NY - In recognition of the skilled treatment provided by the Burn Center at Westchester Medical Center, a member of the Westchester Medical Center Health Network, Senator Terrence Murphy presented the unit with a New York State Senate Resolution on Thursday, February 4th.

The presentation was held as part of National Burn Awareness week, which began February 1st and runs through February 7th. This year marks the 30th anniversary of National Burn

Awareness Week, which was developed by the National Burn Association to promote burn awareness and prevention particularly among high-risk groups, such as children and seniors. The Association will be working in working in conjunction with the National Scald Prevention Campaign to provide information on scalding.
