## SAMMY awards; and

WHEREAS, Under George Rossi's leadership, the New Orleans rhythm and blues inspired Shufflin Hungarians' self-released discs were the most globally successful throughout the history of the Central New York music scene; and

WHEREAS, George Rossi was also recruited to join The Wild Magnolias Mardi Indian Tribe of New Orleans to produce their 25th anniversary recording "Life is a Carnival," on Blue Note Records, and subsequently, he relocated to the Crescent City in 1998, to pursue his interest in New Orleans piano styles; and

WHEREAS, In New Orleans, George Rossi settled down as a featured piano entertainer in the world-famous dueling piano bar, Pat O'Briens; after Hurricane Katrina hit, he returned home to Syracuse, where he has been performing with his Skaneateles childhood mentors and local elder statesmen The Dean Brothers; and

WHEREAS, With deep appreciation, this Legislative Body is pleased to have this opportunity to recognize the spellbinding talent of George Rossi, and to wish him continuing success in all his future endeavors; now, therefore, be it
