WHEREAS, Mark Rutkowski found his home at the Silver Bay YMCA in March of 1986; throughout 18 years of service, he rose quickly through the ranks, holding the positions of Program Director to Associate Executive Director of the Silver Bay Association; throughout his tenure, he made an indelible mark on all who were fortunate enough to cross his path; and

WHEREAS, While at Silver Bay, Mark Rutkowski became involved in the New York State YMCA Youth & Government Program; for the last 12 years, he has held the esteemed position of Director for the New York State Program; and

WHEREAS, Moreover, Mark Rutkowski held numerous leadership roles with the planning committee for the Youth Conference on National Affairs and served as the Chair for the National Youth Governor's Conference in Washington, D.
