Moran upon the occasion of his designation as recipient of a Liberty Medal, the highest honor bestowed upon an individual by the New York State Senate, to be celebrated on Saturday, April 2, 2016; and WHEREAS, The New York State Senate Liberty Medal was established by resolution and is awarded to individuals who have merited special commendation for exceptional, heroic, or humanitarian acts on behalf of their fellow New Yorkers; and

WHEREAS, Raised in Fort Hunter, New York, Roger E. Moran was born the middle son of Ruth and Frank Moran; he had five brothers and one sister, two of whom passed away at a young age; and

WHEREAS, After graduating from Union College in Schenectady, Roger E. Moran enlisted as an aviation cadet in the United States Air Force in January of 1942; after training at various army airfields, he received his pilot's wings at Turner Airfield, in Albany, Georgia, on November 10, 1942; and

WHEREAS, During World War II, Captain Roger E. Moran served in the

Ferrying Command during the American Campaign, the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign and the European-African Campaign delivering planes and fuel; and

WHEREAS, In addition, Captain Roger E. Moran flew on several dangerous missions from India over the Himalayan Mountains to China, delivering tens of thousands of gallons of fuel; and

WHEREAS, For his meritorious and valiant service, Captain Roger E.

Moran was the recipient of numerous awards and accolades including the
Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal, Honorable Service Lapel Button

WWII, American Campaign Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal with three

Bronze Stars, European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign and the World War

Il Victory Medal; and
