WHEREAS, In addition, she holds a permanent New York State Certification in Elementary (N-6) Education; and

WHEREAS, Dana McDonough is the recipient of countless awards and accolades, including the Dean's Award for Excellence for Teacher of the Hudson Valley; she has also twice received the Teaching the Hudson Valley Explore Award and has been published in the National Education Association's NEA TODAY magazine; and

WHEREAS, A child-centered professional who values teaching and learning above all, Dana McDonough is an educator who readily shares her knowledge and experience with her colleagues; and

WHEREAS, Dana McDonough's commitment to family involvement is evident in all that she does as an educator; in addition to meeting with the families of each of her incoming students, she has created programs to provide tools for parents, enabling them to better support their children through the curriculum; and

WHEREAS, Furthermore, Dana McDonough emails parents weekly with updates about lessons and activities to nurture that essential partnership; and
