During the West Point Day ceremonies, Senator Larkin was presented with the Outstanding Civilian Service Medal from the Department of the Army. The medal is in recognition of the Senator's distinguished performance and selfless service in support of the United States Military Academy at West Point.

An estimated 1,200 new cadets enter the Academy each year. Currently, there are over 4,000 cadets enrolled at West Point from every state in the U.S., as well as from several foreign countries. After graduation, cadets are deployed throughout the world and serve on active duty for at least five years.
