BROOKLYN, NY (5/9) – On Friday, May 6th State Senator Kevin Parker held his 5th Annual Educational Leadership Award Breakfast Ceremony in partnership with Healthfirst at the Grand Prospect Hall in Park Slope, Brooklyn. For the fifth year in a row, over 200 community members came together to honor various educational leaders in the 21st Senate District and the larger Brooklyn community. George Hulse, Vice President, of Community Engagement at Healthfirst, served as the MC for the event and New York City Comptroller Scott Stringer

delivered the keynote address.

"Every day, parents of schoolchildren, principals, teachers, and other academic professionals go above and beyond the call to ensure our children receive the best education possible," said New York City Comptroller Scott M. Stringer. "These individuals deserve to be celebrated every day of the year and I'm glad Senator Parker has brought us together today to give them the recognition they deserve."
