Dr. Myers currently serves as Superintendent of Schools in the Brockport Central School District, and has previously served as an Assistant Superintendent Specialist, and High School Counselor during her career with the Rochester City School District. Additionally, she has worked as an adjunct professor at Roberts Wesleyan College, St. John Fisher College and Syracuse University. She was the first African-American President of the New York State School Counselor Association.

Dr. Myers has a passion and heart for young people. She has conducted numerous local, regional and national workshops and presentations to elementary and secondary students, undergraduate and graduate students, administrators, teachers, pupil personnel staff, and for profit and non-profit organizations. Dr. Myers' presentational style is humorous, straightforward, sincere, and she encourages people of all ages and backgrounds to creatively use their abilities and talents to eliminate achievement gaps.
