She also served as Corresponding Secretary for the Sachem SEPTA board from 1999-2000 to be a more effective advocate for the families that needed her assistance.

Ellen's selfless dedication to her two sons and countless others has inspired her daughter Christine to also dedicate herself to this cause by gaining her certification as a Special Education Teacher.
