ALBANY – Amid a growing flood of reports of lead in school drinking water around the state

and the country, a coalition of legislators and New York public health, environment, and

healthy schools advocacy groups will present legislation that will attempt to bring this crisis

under control.

Lead is a major health hazard, especially for young children. It has been found in drinking

water schools in Binghamton, Ithaca, Rochester, and across Long Island.

The groups will present S.7103A (O'Mara)/A.9687A (Lupardo) and discuss the details of the

newly amended legislation.
