Larkin Secures Funds To Replace City Of Newburgh Bridge

Due to Senator Larkin's advocacy, the project has now been accelerated as part of the New York State Department of Transportation's Five-year Capital Plan.

The Lake Drive Bridge, which leads to the main entrance of the Lake Street Apartments, closed in 2015 and has been operating as a temporary span since last December. The bridge was closed after culverts under it began to rust and collapse.
