

Creating Safer Schools: Ritchie secures \$7,500 for Security Upgrades at Lyme Central

With students preparing to head back into the classroom next week, State Senator Patty Ritchie is announcing she has secured \$7,500 in funding to help improve safety in the Lyme Central School District.
