

Senator Martins Announces State Grant Funding For Bryant Library in Roslyn

The Library will use the \$20,000 in state funding to enhance its community programming. The Library will purchase technology and supplies to create a portable "makerspace" for a new pilot program called "Inventors Club." Through the club, both children and adults will be able to create projects using 3-D printers. The printers were purchased using a prior state grant secured by Senator Martins.

"Bryant Library is developing an innovative new program that helps people of all ages utilize cutting edge technology to create and build. It's a great way to get people of all ages engaged in learning, technology and creative thinking," said Senator Martins.
