(DOH) Commissioner Howard Zucker at the Legislature's Joint Public Hearing on Water Quality and Contamination

In particular, O'Mara highlighted DOH's swift adoption of regulations to implement a recently enacted state law sponsored by O'Mara and Southern Tier Assemblywoman Donna Lupardo (D-Endwell) requiring schools to test their drinking water systems for lead contamination.
