Additionally, New York State launched a new breast cancer "textline" earlier this year to help women find access to nearby breast cancer screenings. To use the service, residents should text "get screened" from their cell phones to 81336. After providing their zip code, the service will reply with a message containing nearby screening locations that offer extended hours.
