ALBANY, NY—With New York State Senate committee assignments officially handed up today, Senator Sue Serino (R, C, I—Hyde Park) announced that she will remain the Chair of the Senate's Aging Committee.

"Having the opportunity to serve New York's seniors has been a highlight of my time in the Senate and it is a distinct honor to continue doing so," said Senator Serino, who was named Aging Chair in her first term. My commitment to tackling elder abuse and ensuring that our seniors have the resources they need to age in place remains unwavering, and I will continue to push to ensure that our seniors aren't

left behind come budget time."
