State Senator Patty Ritchie welcomed visitors and dignitaries from Canada to the Capitol Tuesday for a day of events aimed at celebrating the unique relationship that exists between New York State and the country.

Those visiting included Phyllis Yaffe, Counsel General of Canada in New York and Royal Canadian Mounted Police Constable Maxime Cormier, among others.

Visitors were honored during the day's Senate session with an official Resolution recognizing the nation, as well as the cultural and economic ties that exist between Canada and the United States.
