Brooklyn, NY (1/18/2016) – On Martin Luther King Day, more than two thousand New York City residents joined State Senator Kevin Parker (D, WF) for his 13th Annual Martin Luther King Jr. Tribute Concert in conjunction with the A Shared Dream Foundation. The event, held at The Walt Whitman Theater located at Brooklyn College, is one of the largest Dr. King holiday celebrations in New York City and this year's tribute featured award winning gospel musician, Vashawn Mitchell and was hosted by WBLS Radio Personality, Liz Black.
