WHEREAS, Dedicated to her community, Peggy Tremper was a member of the Walker Valley Catholic Society, G. Paul Betteinger Post, American Legion Auxiliary, VFW Ladies Auxiliary and the Pine Bush Area Library Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, Predeceased by her husband, Albert J. Tremper, one son, Charles Tremper, two brothers, William and John Yarwood, and sister, Catherine Boxberger, Peggy Tremper is survived by her three sons, James, Martin (Victoria), Phillip (Kimberly); 10 grandchildren, Martin, James, Anneliese, Stella, Christopher, Amelia, Ryan, Jared, Ariene and Steven; and three great-grandchildren, Viviana, Violette and Riley; as well as one sister, Patricia Russak; and
