

Senator Phillips Honors Manhasset "Scholars" For Earning National Recognition in Regeneron Science Competition

Senator Elaine Phillips (R-Manhasset) recently honored Manhasset High School students for earning national recognition in the country's oldest high school science competition.

Manhasset High School students Riya Gilja, Michael Lee and Parker Van Roy were each named "scholars" as first round winners in the Regeneron Science Talent Search. Riya, Michael and Parker were three of only 300 students from across the country to earn the

honor.
