WHEREAS, Rexford Z. Thornton served as a Bainbridge Town Councilman for 34 years, as well as Town Justice from 1970 to 1974; he was also a past member of the Bainbridge Sportsman Club; and

WHEREAS, During his life, Rexford Z. Thornton took immense pride in his children's and grandchildren's activities; he was often heard loudly cheering at a wrestling match, basketball, soccer or softball game, stock car races, and the BG Band trips; and

WHEREAS, Furthermore, he sincerely enjoyed the many years the Bainbridge-Guilford kindergarten students came to his farm to make apple cider; and
