WHEREAS, During his life, Irving Natofsky held a career as a United States Postal Worker and as a watchmaker in the Diamond District of New York City; in his free time, he is an active participant of local synagogues, which earned him the name "The Rabbi"; and

WHEREAS, With him throughout have been his friends, who have shown him love and support and rejoice in his many accomplishments; and

WHEREAS, Irving Natofsky, with his zest for life, has inspired and enhanced the lives of his family and friends; he is always a pleasant person who loves to be around others; and

WHEREAS, This exceptional nonagenarian has experienced the incredible joys and sorrows characteristic of and reserved for those with the stamina and courage to savor a full life; and
