Senate Resolution No. 3063

BY: Senator FLANAGAN

ESTABLISHING a plan setting forth an itemized list of grantees for a certain appropriation for the 2017-18 state fiscal year for grants in aid for drug, violence, and crime control and prevention programs; for grants that prevent domestic violence or aid victims of domestic violence; grants for civil or criminal domestic violence legal services or veterans civil or criminal legal services; grants for law enforcement, anti-drug, anti-violence, crime prevention and treatment programs; and grants for law enforcement and emergency service agencies for equipment and technology enhancements, as required by a plan setting forth an itemized list of grantees with the amount to be received by each, or the methodology for allocating such appropriation. Such plan shall be subject to the approval of the temporary president of the senate and the director of the budget and thereafter shall be included in a resolution calling for the expenditure of such monies, which resolution must be approved by a majority vote of all members elected to the senate upon a roll call vote; amending senate resolution R6506 that establishes a plan setting forth an itemized list of grantees for certain appropriations

for the 2016-17 state fiscal year; and amending senate resolution R6135 that establishes a plan setting forth an itemized list of grantees for certain appropriations for the 2014-15 state fiscal year.

RESOLVED, That pursuant to and as required by moneys appropriated in section 1 of chapter 53 of the laws of 2017 which enacts the aid to localities budget to the crime prevention and reduction strategies program from the special revenue fund/Edward Byrne Memorial Grant account for grants in aid for drug, violence, and crime control and prevention programs. Such funds shall be apportioned pursuant to a plan setting forth an itemized list of grantees with the amount to be received by each, or the methodology for allocating such appropriation. Such plan shall be subject to the approval of the temporary president of the senate and the director of the budget and thereafter shall be included in a resolution calling for the expenditure of such monies, which resolution must be approved by a majority vote of all members elected to the senate upon a roll call vote, in accordance with the following schedule:
