NEW YORK – State Senator Brad Hoylman (D, WF-Manhattan) released the following statement today lauding the Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) for its decision to designate two of the New York Public Library's (NYPL) interior spaces as New York City landmarks. This letter followed a request by Senator Hoylman in 2013 to designate the Rose Main Reading Room.
