

Senator Gallivan Announces Funding for Local Libraries

Senator Patrick M. Gallivan (R-C-I, Elma) announced grants to eleven public libraries in Erie County that are located in the 59th State Senate District. The libraries will share a total of \$32,500.

"Public libraries enrich the lives of residents of all ages by providing access to books, films, computers and the internet," Gallivan said. "People can do research, advance their education, write a resume or search for a job from the comfort of their neighborhood library. It's important to make sure these facilities have the resources necessary to meet the needs of

the communities they serve."

The grants are to be used for technology related programs and services, including the purchase of computer equipment, or security related items. The following libraries will receive funding:
