GENEVA – Senator Pam Helming received the Farm Family Advocate of the Year Award from NY FarmNet during the organization's annual banquet on Wednesday, Nov. 8 at the Ramada Inn Lakefront in Geneva. "Our farmers – especially our family farmers – face a number of challenges that go beyond planting crops and raising animals. Farming is a 24-hour-a-day, seven-day-a-week work operation. Often, family farmers live at their workplace, so stresses on the farm easily follow them home at the end of the day. That is why I am proud to support NY FarmNet, which helps our farmers with a diverse array of both business training and personal services. It is critical that we give our farmers every tool that they need to make their farms as productive as possible, while improving their personal well being and that of their families," Senator Helming said.
