Among her many accomplishments, Henning-Piedmonte was named Putnam Northern Westchester BOCES Administrator of the Year for 2017. She was given the award by the librarians in her district for encouraging and supporting innovative instruction.

Henning-Piedmonte has more than twenty-four years of experience as an educator. She was

previously Middle School Principal for Uniondale High School, Reading Teacher for Dyker Heights Intermediate School, Senior Research Associate for The National Center for Restructuring Education, Schools and Teachers; Assistant Superintendent for Clarkstown Central School District, and prior to becoming Superintendent, served as Deputy Superintendent for the Brewster Central School District.

Henning-Piedmonte has a Doctorate of Education and a Master of Education from Columbia University. She has a B.A. in Business with a minor in English from Mount Mary University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
