MEMORIALIZING Governor Andrew M. Cuomo to proclaim March 2018, as Problem Gambling Awareness Month in New York State

WHEREAS, The 2018 Theme of the National Council on Program
Gambling's Awareness Month is "Have the Conversation," and aims to
increase awareness of problem gambling and the availability of
prevention, treatment and recovery services, as well as to encourage
healthcare providers to screen for problem gambling; now, therefore, be
