WHEREAS, He then worked as an instructor for CUNY Queens College for two years, an assistant professor at Hofstra University for an additional two years, and an associate professor at St. John's University for another year; and

WHEREAS, In September of 1980, Dr. Geoffrey R. Horlick began his tenure as a professor with St. Francis College; for 30 of those years, he held the title of Chair of the Department; after almost four decades of service, he will officially retire from his esteemed role as an educator in 2018; and

WHEREAS, In this capacity, Dr. Geoffrey R. Horlick designed both the bachelor's and master's degrees in accounting, and has been a vital member of numerous committees and councils; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Geoffrey R. Horlick has also served as a business

consultant since 1975, and has written various publications; he belongs to the American Accounting Association, American Institute of CPAs, the New York State Society of CPAs, and the Financial Accounting Standards Board; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Geoffrey R. Horlick's quest for excellence is well-known; he attributes much of his success to the dedicated ethical team of educators, supportive friends, caring and involved parents, and wonderful, enthusiastic students; and
