WHEREAS, Furthermore, she is a member of the American Association of University Women, as well as a 40-year member of the New York Chapter Honorary International Educators Society where she served as President from 2000 to 2002; and

WHEREAS, Having walked on all seven continents, Florence Wood has served as a volunteer tutor with the Literacy Volunteers of America for 12 years; she teaches Citizenship and has helped 38 adults and two children become United States citizens; and

WHEREAS, With a steadfast and unwavering commitment to her community, Florence Wood was recognized in 2017 as the Unsung Heroine of the Year by the local chapter of the New York State Women, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, Rare indeed is the impressive dedication shown by an individual for the benefit of others which Florence Wood has displayed throughout her life; and
