"It's important for students to learn the latest in the culinary arts in an up-to-date kitchen," said Senator Ritchie. "I am pleased to secure this funding, which will help our future chefs gain the hands-on experience they need to be successful in their future careers."

The funding was used to purchase a host of new commercial equipment, including ranges, sinks, work tables, griddles, a refrigerator, and much more.

"The Culinary Arts Program is one of our most popular and fastest growing programs," said Steve Todd, District Superintendent of Jefferson-Lewis-Hamilton-Herkimer-Oneida BOCES. "We are deeply grateful to the Senator for this grant, as it has allowed us to do much-needed equipment modernization in this busy learning space, which benefits over 60 area high school students each day."
