Senate Resolution No. 5910

establishing a plan setting forth a methodology for allocating certain appropriations for the 2018-2019 state fiscal year for services and expenses related to recommendations of the Senate Taskforce on Lyme and Tick Borne Diseases, and for services and expenses related to public health improvement initiatives, including but not limited to reducing the risks and effects to children that are associated with the exposure to lead. Such plan shall be subject to the approval of the Temporary President of the Senate and the Director of the Budget and thereafter shall be included in a resolution calling for the expenditure of such monies, which resolution must be approved by a majority vote of all members elected to the Senate upon a roll call vote

RESOLVED, That pursuant to and as required by moneys appropriated in section 1 of chapter 53 of the laws of 2018 which enacts the aid to localities, local assistance account from the center for community health program for services and expenses related to recommendations of the Senate Taskforce on Lyme and Tick Borne Diseases. Such funds shall be apportioned pursuant to a plan setting forth an itemized list of grantees with the amount to be received by each, or the methodology for allocating such appropriation. RESOLVED, That pursuant to and as required by moneys appropriated in section 1 of chapter 53 of the laws of 2018 which enacts the aid to localities, local assistance account from the center for environmental health program for services and expenses related to public health improvement initiatives including the counties currently participating in the department of health's primary prevention of childhood lead poisoning program through a strengthened partnership with code enforcement agencies in targeted municipalities, and including but not limited to reducing the risks and effects to children that are associated with the exposure to lead. Such funds shall be apportioned pursuant to a plan setting forth an itemized list of grantees with the amount to be received by each, or the methodology for allocating such appropriation.
