Assistant Attorney General Brown will teach residents how to identify the red flags of the most common phone, postal, mail and email scams targeting seniors. Scammers are constantly developing new schemes and new ways to target seniors, but fraud prevention experts have

identified the basic anatomy of a scam and the "hooks" they use. The most common hooks rely on people looking for a good deal, wanting to help those they care about, or putting the person in a state of fear or desperation. These events will help arm seniors with the tools and knowledge to always stay one step ahead of the scammer.
