Brooklyn, NY (8/28/18) – On Saturday, August 25, State Senator Kevin Parker hosted the 11th Annual Harvest Fest Back-To-School Celebration at Paerdegat Park in Central Brooklyn. The free community event in partnership with HealthFirst, Sears/Kmart, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Inc., Delta Rho Omega Chapter and Spectrum, provided over 2,000 backpacks filled with school supplies to students that attended. said Senator Parker.

The Brooklyn Public Library participated at the event with their mobile library unit, and there were free onsite screenings by the National Black Association for Speech-Language and Hearing (NBASLH) and vision screenings by the Stuy Park Lions Club. Delta Rho Omega Chapter, stated, "Our chapter enjoys partnering with Senator Parker every year for his Annual Harvest Fest event.
