

Wondering how to dispose of your artificial Christmas Tree?

ISSUE: RECYCLING



If you are wondering, like I was, how best to dispose of an artificial Christmas Tree, I hope the general information below can be helpful.

There are several options.

You can contact your waste management service to coordinate the disposal of your tree as part of your regular waste stream. Each service and hauler will have their own standards on what is acceptable to transport, so call ahead for details and to make arrangements before leaving it curbside. In this case, trees will likely end up in landfills.
