## **Broome District Attorney's Operation SAFE (Saving Addicts From Epidemic)**

- Pairs addicts with out-of-area treatment facilities. In some cases, the program links addicts with low- to no-cost treatments.
- Must be a Broome County resident.
- Addicts must be willing to enter long-term treatment outside of New York.
- The Program will not accept sex offenders, those with active arrest warrants, or defendants currently enrolled in Binghamton Drug Treatment Court.

- Not a treatment facility

## **Salvation Army**

- 65 beds – rehabilitation program for adult males. They do not have a detox center or medical staff on site.
- Must be drug and alcohol free for 48 hours to be admitted.
- Cannot serve individuals with severe mental disorders or a record of being a pedophile.
- Length of stay – up to 7 months
- Cost to stay is dependent on the persons income, but individuals with no income are not turned away
- Salvation Army in Syracuse and Rochester offer services for women

- Not a treatment facility

## **YWCA of Broome County**

- Emergency Housing
  - Homeless women and their dependent children for up to 21 days
  - Focus on stabilizing women in crisis
  - Payment through DSS or private pay of \$25/night
  - (p) 607-772-0340 ext. 235, 223, or 241
- Intensive Independent Living Program
  - Permanent supportive housing program for women aged 18 – 29 and their dependent children
  - Provides case management and counseling with a Masters level counselor
  - 7 month minimum commitment required
  - Rent is either DSS funded or 30% of gross income

- Shelter Plus care Program

- Permanent supportive housing program with case management and counseling – must be referred by a case manager
- Rent: program receives a subsidy from US Dept of Housing and Urban Development for partial rent, resident is responsible for the other portion through DSS or private pay

- Bridge Program
  - 8 apartments for women with opioid addictions that have recently given birth
  - 7 month minimum stay, maximum 18 month
  - A phone number for this program is not available at this time
