SUBJECT: To examine alternative methods of financing public education in New York State

PURPOSE: To hear from national experts in economics and school finance about potential alternatives to New York State's current financing of public education, including additions, alternatives and modifications to existing sources of revenue.

The Senate Committees on Education and Budget and Revenues are jointly undertaking a series of public hearings to learn from national experts about alternative methods of financing public education, with subsequent hearings to explore ways to advance new revenue sources and improve distribution of funding for public schools.
