

Senator Sanders' Remembers Victims on 2nd Anniversary of Charlottesville Attack

State Senator James Sanders said:

These are trying times to be an American. Two years ago today, in the streets of Charlottesville, Virginia, we watched the sleeping dragon of racism and hatred emerge and spread death in its wake.
