Senate Deputy Leader Gianaris Announces \$10,000 Grant For PS/IS 78Q's Mandarin Language Program, Preparing Students For A Global Economy

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LONG ISLAND CITY, N.Y. – Senate Deputy Leader Michael Gianaris announced a \$10,000 grant to support PS/IS 78Q's Interactive Language Program which begins preparing students for a global economy by using technology to facilitate early-age foreign language instruction from teachers across the globe. Senator Gianaris made this announcement during the school's first PTA meeting of the school year.

My Chinese Teacher Program, MCT, is a Mandarin foreign language program using technology to connect to a China-based teaching team. The Chinese teacher uses video conferencing technology and connects to the classroom to provide a Chinese language and culture program.

The classroom receives a weekly 25-minute Mandarin lesson by video conference while

classroom teachers provide follow up instruction taking students through their workbooks, pronunciation videos and by introducing Chinese language and culture concepts across the rest of the school curriculum.

Students also have opportunities to interact with their Chinese teacher by sending them postcards, sharing photos from their school through our learning platform and engaging in other blended learning activities
