The materials will also be available at satellite locations, FIAO Il Centro at 8711 18th Avenue in Brooklyn and the Gerritsen Beach Library at 2808 Gerritsen Ave, as well as all schools in Senate District 22 and local libraries.

The 2020 Neighborhood Reading Challenge is for all ages and will include local schools, libraries, senior centers and other civic groups. Readers are encouraged to set a goal for themselves or their institutions and, if they choose, to take part in friendly competition between institutions for most books read.
