



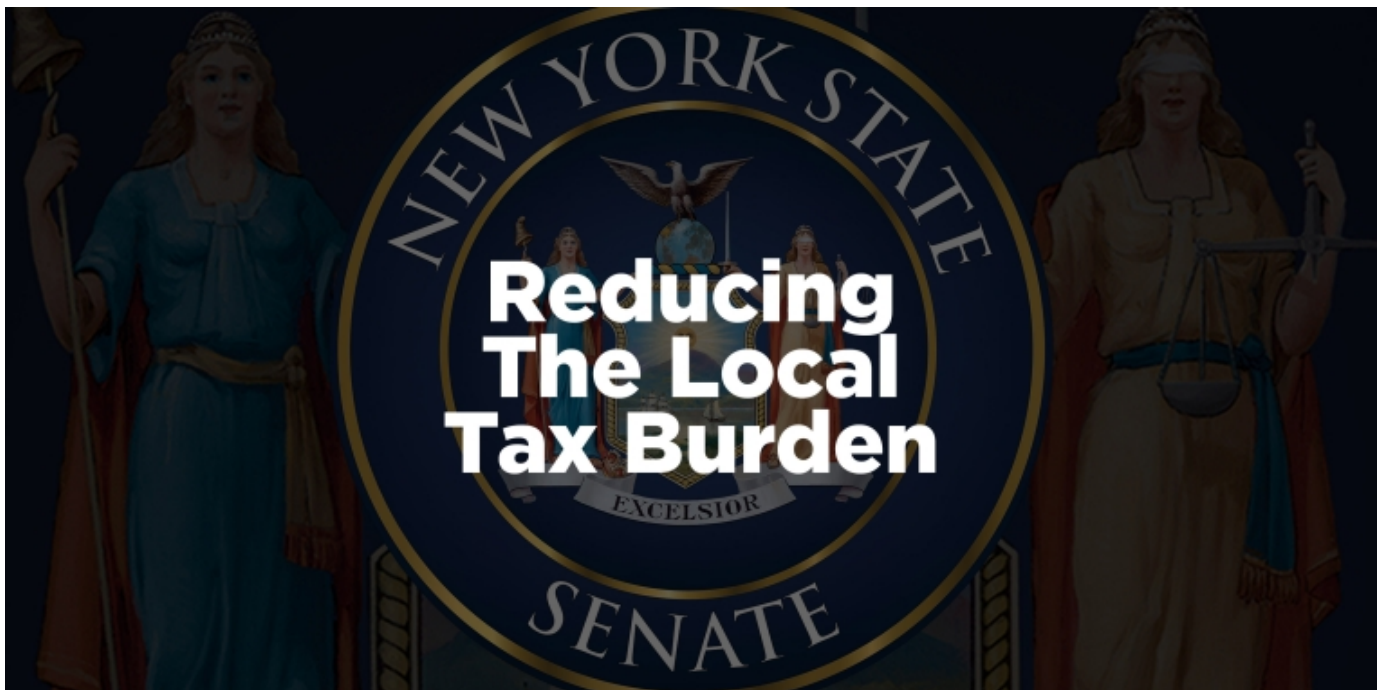

Kaplan** (D-Great Neck) announced today that she has secured a \$50,000 grant for the Village of Great Neck Plaza to fund roadway and infrastructure repairs. The grant is funded through the State and Municipal Facilities Program, and is the first of many local grants to be announced by Senator Kaplan under the program.
