## Dear Friends:

Like millions of Americans, I am angered and deeply distraught over the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis, and the pattern of repeated deaths of black Americans at the hands of police officers throughout our country. As a white person, I will never know the fear and trepidation of black and brown Americans when dealing with our law enforcement system. But I feel the outrage, and I must speak up and demand change to the culture that feeds this terrible moment.

We must join together for a more just America working with intention, urgency, good faith and a willingness to confront the stain of racism that has for too long plagued our land.
