POUGHKEEPSIE, NY – Each year, the New York State Legislative Women's Caucus creates a unique 'Women's History Month' Display in the Capitol's Legislative Office Building to celebrate trailblazing New York women. This year, with the Capitol still closed to visitors, the Caucus took their celebration virtual to honor 'Essential Women' for their work during the COVID-19 pandemic. As part of the initiative, Senator Sue Serino honored essential worker, and Poughkeepsie City School District Food Service Employee, Brenda McKinney for her

efforts to help keep local students safe and healthy during this time. Senator Serino stopped by Clinton Elementary School in Poughkeepsie on Monday, April 19th, to present Brenda with the distinguished honor.

"Brenda McKinney truly exemplifies what it means to be essential," said Senator Serino. "When our student's lives were completely transformed due to the pandemic, Brenda stepped up to ensure that each student had a balanced meal every day, even during remote learning.
