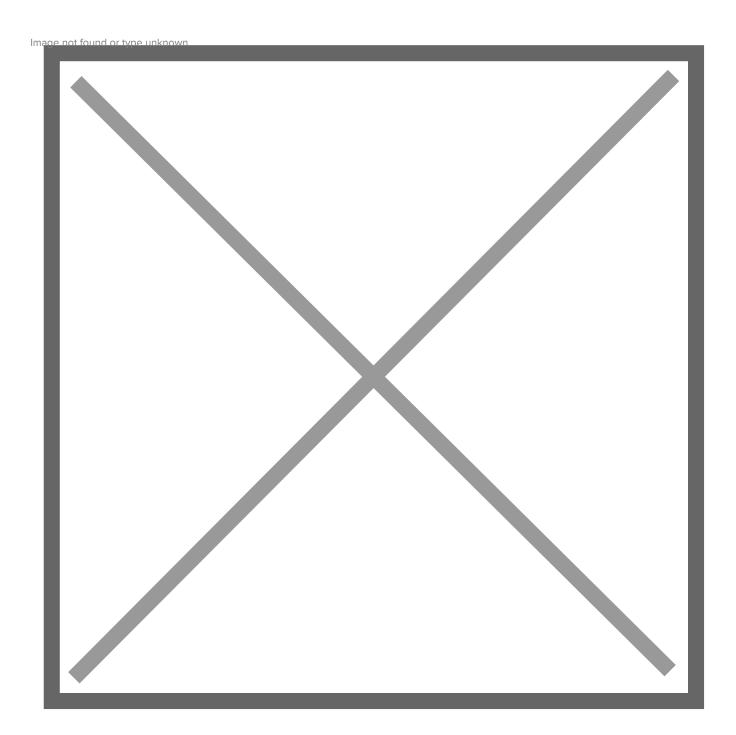


Griffo presents New York State Senate Commendation Awards
