Students selected to receive the New York State Senate Youth Leadership Recognition Award will receive a congratulatory personalized certificate from Senator Addabbo.

A participation packet has been sent to eligible schools in Addabbo's district that informs faculty on how they can nominate students.

All nominations must be submitted online at Senator Addabbo's website by March 25, 2022, by filling out the online nomination form, attaching a recommendation letter and the student's brief statement about their accomplishment(s).
