“It’s now time to put crime victims first by passing my legislation ‘Christopher’s and Deanna’s Law’ ([S.2046/A.5335](#)) in their memory. ‘Christopher’s and Deanna’s Law’ requires all victim impact statements to be video recorded and mandates all Parole Board members who vote on parole for an offender, must watch the videos before making their decision.”
